ORDINANCE 1170

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BROKEN BOW, NEBRASKA AMENDING SECTION 91-19: WEEDS; LITTER; STAGNET WATER, SUBSECTION (G) TO ADD WILDFLOWERS AS IT RELATES TO THE BROKEN BOW MUNICIPAL CODE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING A TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROKEN BOW, NEBRASKA:

Section 1: That Section 91-19 (G) of the Broken Bow Municipal Code be amended to add Wildflowers to read as follows:

WILDFLOWERS

- (a) Applicability.
 - (1) Private or publicly owned property located within the city limits of the city or under the authority of the city codes and their compliance enforced by the city.
 - (2) Public property held by or for the benefit of the city and its residents or any agency, board or commission within the city limits or under the authority of the city codes and their compliance enforced by the city.
- (b) Management plan. All property owners or property owner designee shall:
 - (1) Agree to mow and maintain a 36-inch swath or buffer, beginning at the curb and is adjacent to the street.
 - (2) Agree to maintain a mowed or other maintained access for utility service providers to their respective meters or outside the house hookups (water meter, phone jack, electric meter, gas meter and/or tanks, cable box) and postal service (mailbox);
 - (3) Agree to maintain a mowed or other maintained access to the main entrance of the house that currently complies with the current height of grass ordinance for emergency responders (fire department, law enforcement, and emergency medical personnel);
 - (4) Agree to maintain property covered under the variance free of trash, cars, boats, and all other in-organic items. The purpose of the approval must be for habitat and wildlife purposes not to hide or stockpile junk and debris;

- (5) Agree to exhibit a plaque that demonstrates the property has been registered for a height of grass variance. The plaque must show the registration number (assigned by the city) and the designated mow month.
- (6) Agree to mow or remove old woody growth of herbaceous layer annually.

- Section 3: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
